FAR WEST DIVISION DIRECTORS REPORT
Far West Division Board Meeting
Davis, California August 4, 2012

Another winter is in the books for the Far West Division. The biggest accomplishment this year was the work done by our staff in rewriting legislation (AB 1245) for California. The Professional Firefighters Union tried to get the legislature to enact legislation that would have severely limited who could be licensed as a first responder in California. If passed this legislation would have required licensing and background checks for all first responders and that would have included all OEC technicians in the NSP in California. With a lot of help from our industry partners; CSAA, Mammoth Mountain Ski Area, Squaw Valley Ski Area and the owner of the Mt Shasta Ski Park, we met several times with the other stakeholders at the Cal-EMSA office in Sacramento. The outcome of these meetings produced an exemption for members of the National Ski Patrol while performing duties at Ski Areas in California. This is a major milestone in the nations EMS and is already starting to have an effect on the ski industry in this and other states. At this time we are still waiting to hear if this legislation will be passed and if the Governor will sign it. If not we will still work with CalEMSA to be sure that the exemption is included in the California EMR regulations.

Again I am happy to report that the Far West Division is adding yet another new patrol to the Division. In our Southern California Region the San Gabriel National Forest has requested NSP patrol coverage of their Nordic ski trails. Members from neighboring Nordic patrols are pitching in to help form this new patrol. Also, the other newer patrols in our Division are report great success. Our newest Alpine patrol at Kirkwood Ski Area is growing and hopes to add additional members this next season. One of our Nordic patrols even supported a biathlon at Mammoth Mountain Ski Area, working closely with their patrol.

With the rather poor snow in the Sierras this last season, some of the programs that were scheduled had to be postponed or cancelled. This created opportunities for our patrols and regions to provide events at a more local level. Without our Winter Education Conference being held, Squaw Valley stepped up and provided a regional SEM. It was so successful that this may provide a model for future programs. This summer two of our regions are combining forces to conduct an Instructor Recertification Conference. Also in the works are new Senior Manuals for OEC and OET. We have had numerous conference calls and are working towards helping produce quality manuals that we can all use.

I have been active on the National Level. I was selected by my fellow Division Directors to serve on this year's nominating committee for the National Board of Directors elections. With a lot of teleconferences we were able to select a very qualified slate of candidates and would like to encourage all of our members in participating in this year's election. Also, I serve on the Planning committee, Governance subcommittee for elections / list of needs, and have been selected to be the assistant spokesperson for the Division Directors Team. There has been a lot of work on the National P&P with a draft that will be going to the National Board. The last section to be reworked covers the code of conduct. In my spare time I have attended as many regional meetings as I could and just recently met with the rest of the division staff to prepare this year's budget. I visited Southern California for a fellow patroller's memorial service and will be attending their Regional Awards Banquet in September.

Another winter is in the books for the Far West Division. A tough season for skiing, the Division made important steps forward with expense alignment and program delivery alignment model change. This year instead of running our events with a net loss of ~\$9000 we took another look at our program delivery model and are trying to push the subject matter experts out to the Regions for broader transfer of info our members. After reviewing the attendance of past years we noticed we were getting the same people to the conference events and our transfer of knowledge was not as widespread as we hoped. The Board expects the new program will increase the transfer of knowledge and skills to help build our brand and keep our product quality top rated.

Hosting the Summer Budget planning meeting at my house we discussed issues facing the Division at both the National level and the Division. State of CAL EMS program changes were discussed and it seems we have a workable solution for the NSP members and will avoid the background checks and bi-annual fees as OEC providers.

Funding for the program discussions were lively and all programs submitting programs were funded at near the requested amounts.

Going into this season, I look forward to working with the program supervisors as we implement the new program delivery model, supervisor delivery at the region and multi-patrol level.

Looking forward to better snow for skiing in season 2012 – 2013.

- 5 OEC classes held in East Bay, Tahoe (2 Intensive), Reno, and Incline.
- Morrow and Tatsukawa attended NAS in October, 2011 with financial assistance from ESR.
- 5 new ID Instructors: 2 from Northstar, 3 from Homewood.
- 2 SEM hosted by Squaw Valley and Homewood; 15 evaluated from ESR and MLR
- Senior Ski and Toboggan at Squaw Valley; __ evaluated from ESR and MLR

NORTHSTAR: now owned by Vail Corp, volunteers in all resorts same training and benefits; WEC at Northstar (?), starting Aux. group of patrollers, Tough Mudder in September.

HEAVENLY: also owned by Vail Corp; beta testing on-line refresher, closed; ~6 candidates.

HOMEWOOD new PR Dave Stromswold; permits for development in 2014; management shuffle

MAUNA KEA: 6 patrollers, concerns are recertification in OEC, OET and recruitment; ageing patrol

MT. ROSE: shrinking numbers; no new candidates this year thus far.

SIERRA AT TAHOE: will host SEM March, 2013; 32 active last year; 1 new this year.

SQUAW VALLEY: now owned with Alpine; 80 patrollers; losing ~3, gaining ~3 new cand/transfers.

TAHOE DONNER: new PR Dave Low; ageing patrol, OET instructor(s) needed, Nye will assist.

TAHOE X-C: new patrol, PR Tom Moore; no snow, rough start; recruiting dual enrolled patrollers
